Report:

Narayana engineering college, Nellore Department of ECE conducted a seminar on "GENDER EQUALITY". It was organized by women's forum of the ECE department on 20-01-23 at Vishweswaraya Auditorium, B-Block, NEC Nellore.



The objective of this program is to convey that Gender disparities often start small in early childhood. Worldwide, girls and boys are just as likely to be registered at birth and immunized against life-threatening diseases. Many participate in preschool at similar rates. And as they grow, girls are equally – or slightly more – developmentally on track than boys.

In this session Dr.Murali, HOD of ECE addressed the gathering and introduced the resource persons, to the gathering. Later the resource person discussed with the students how Every child deserves to reach her or his full potential, but gender inequalities in their lives and in the lives of those who care for them hinder this reality.

Wherever they live in India girls and boys see gender inequality in their homes and communities every day – in textbooks, in movies, in the media and among the men and women who provide their care and support.

In this session the resource person discussed with the students and covered the Gender equality, besides being a fundamental human right, is **essential to achieve peaceful societies, with full human potential and sustainable development**. Moreover, it has been shown that empowering women spurs productivity and economic growth.

Equality between men and women exists when both sexes are able to share equally in the distribution of power and influence; have equal opportunities for financial independence through work or through setting up businesses; enjoy equal access to education and the opportunity to develop personal ambitions, interests and ...

SDG 5 is focused on pursuing the main goal of real and sustained gender equality in all aspects of women and girls' lives which includes (1) **ending gender disparities**, (2) eliminating violence against women and girls' lives, (3) eliminating early and forced marriage, (4) securing equal participation and opportunities . Gender equality **prevents violence against women and girls**. It's essential for economic prosperity. Societies that value women and men as equal are safer and healthier. Gender equality is a human right.

She concluded in her speech that Across India gender inequality results in unequal opportunities, and while it impacts on the lives of both genders, statistically it is girls that are the most disadvantaged.

Globally girls have higher survival rates at birth, are more likely to be developmentally on track, and just as likely to participate in preschool, but **India are the only large country where more girls die than boys**. Girls are also more likely to drop out of school.



Women's Forum

In India girls and boys experience adolescence differently. While boys tend to experience greater freedom, girls tend to face extensive limitations on their ability to move freely and to make decisions affecting their work, education, marriage and social relationships.
